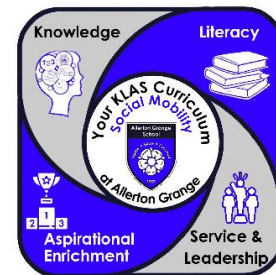




Courses, colleges and Services for those age 16-18 who are Not in Education, Employment or Training

Who are NCS?



NCS is where young people can find their strengths and become world-and work-ready. Their mission is to inspire generations of citizens through shared experiences that develop character and bridge social divides.

NCS provide a range of experiences to help 16-17 year olds develop their skills. This includes away from home experiences, local community experiences, online experiences and other online resources. They fund projects across the country (like the Nxt Steps project) helping young people and even offer paid work placements.





Who are Barca Leeds?

Barca-Leeds is a community based charity. We are an organisation that delivers transformational projects for adults, children, young people and families in Leeds, connecting them with services that respond to the needs of each individual.



We work to reduce social isolation and support people in developing their own initiatives. We support people struggling with housing issues, finances, physical and mental health problems. Our services are also geared towards children, young people and adults affected by domestic abuse, drug and alcohol issues, as well as people struggling with employment or education.

What is Nxt Steps?



Nxt Steps is a partnership programme led by Barca-Leeds with support from Leeds City Council and Leeds Youth Alliance. The programme helps 16 to 17 year olds (up to 25 for those with an EHCP or Care Experienced), who are at risk of or already Not in Education, Employment or Training (NEET) to develop life skills, work readiness, get involved in social activity, and move back towards education, employment and training

What do engagement workers do?

Our practitioners are skilled in engaging, inspiring and motivating young people to raise aspirations and take positive steps towards work. Through 1:1 support we work to develop skills, confidence, resilience and ways of managing their wellbeing to help progress towards EET. We do this by:

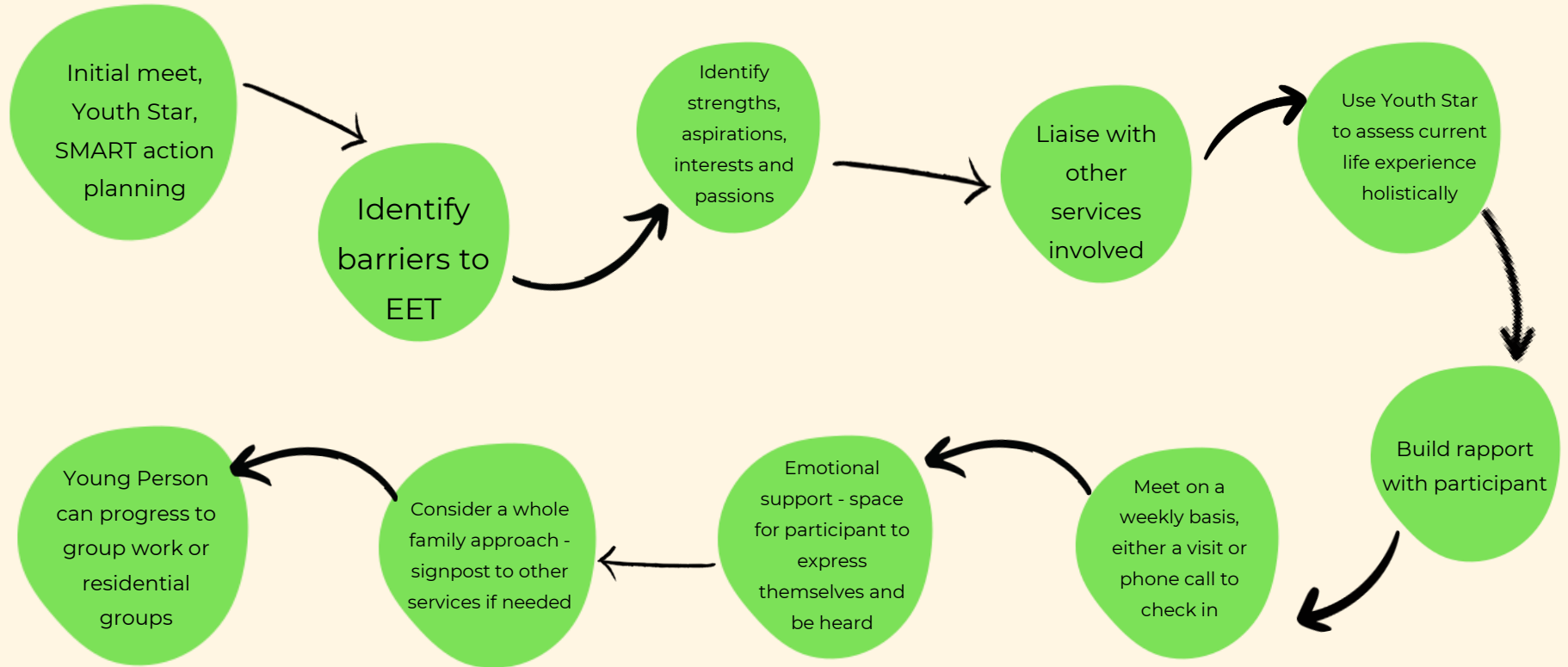

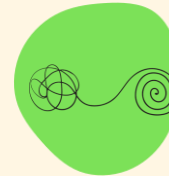

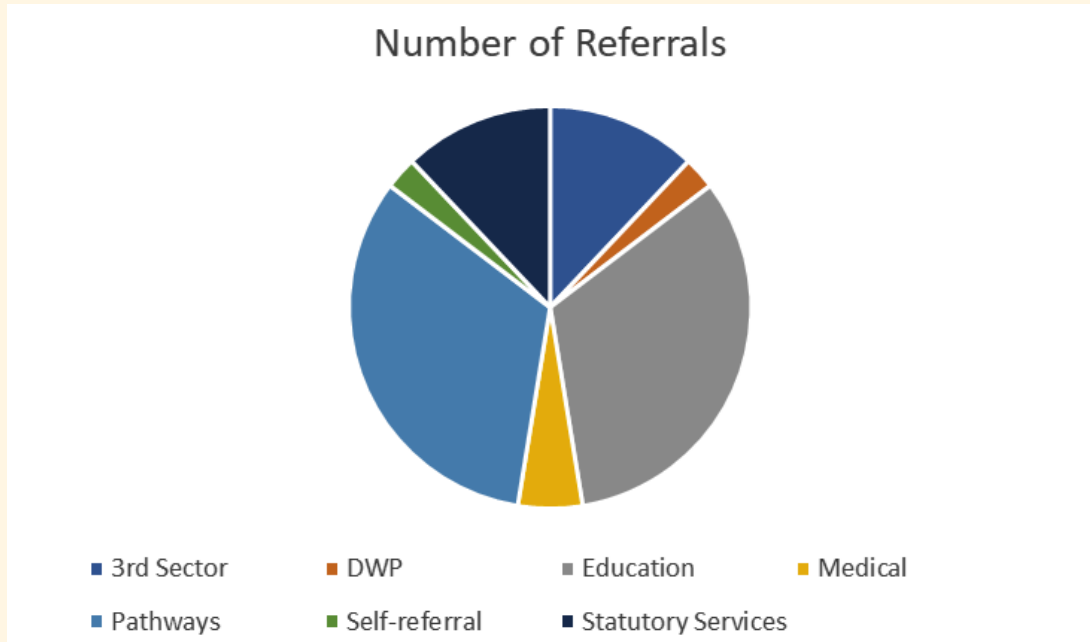
- aged 16* to 17 (up to 25 for those with an existing or in progress Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP), or Care Experienced)

- at risk of or already NEET (Not in Education, Employment or Training).

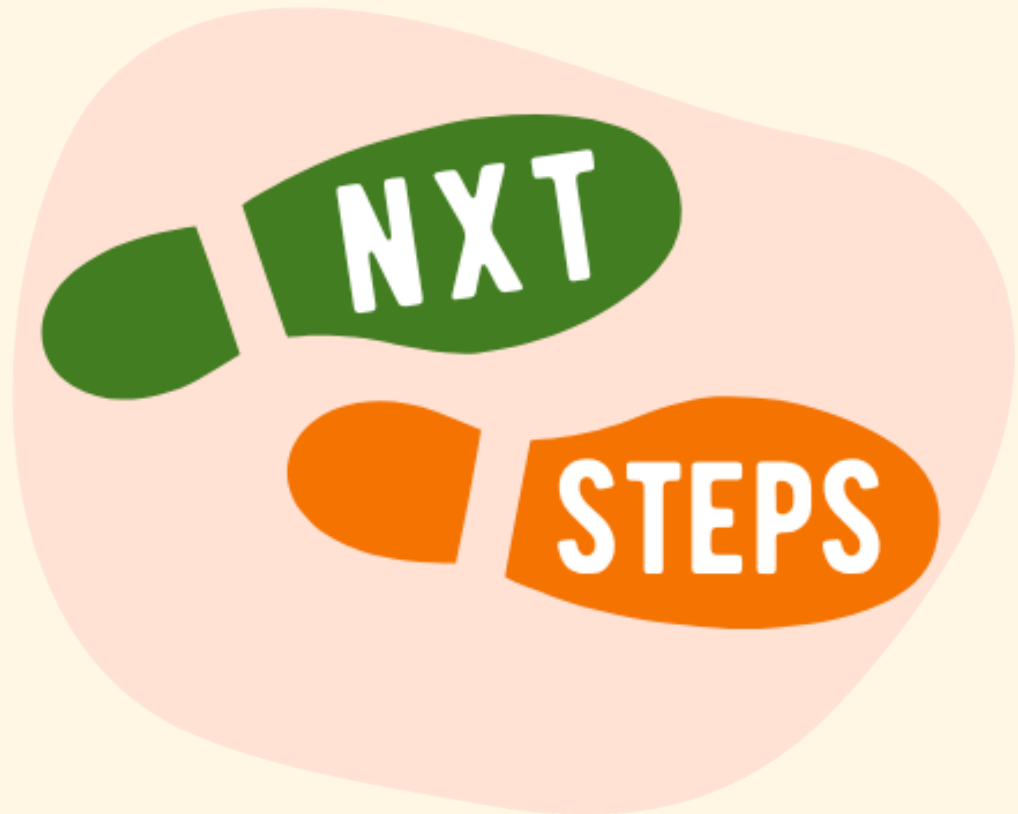

Referral statistics

The majority of Nxt Steps referrals come from education settings or the Pathways Team. 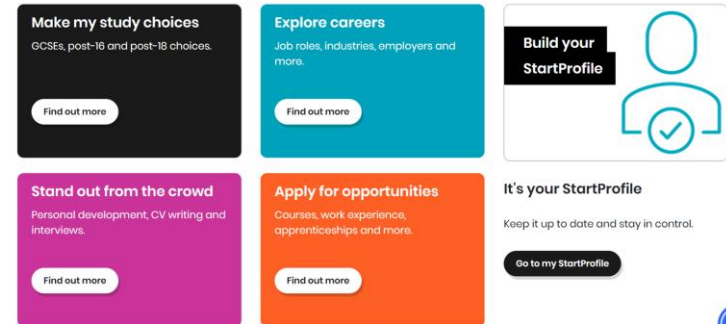

Apprenticeships

- We deliver awareness sessions for students in years 10 and above.

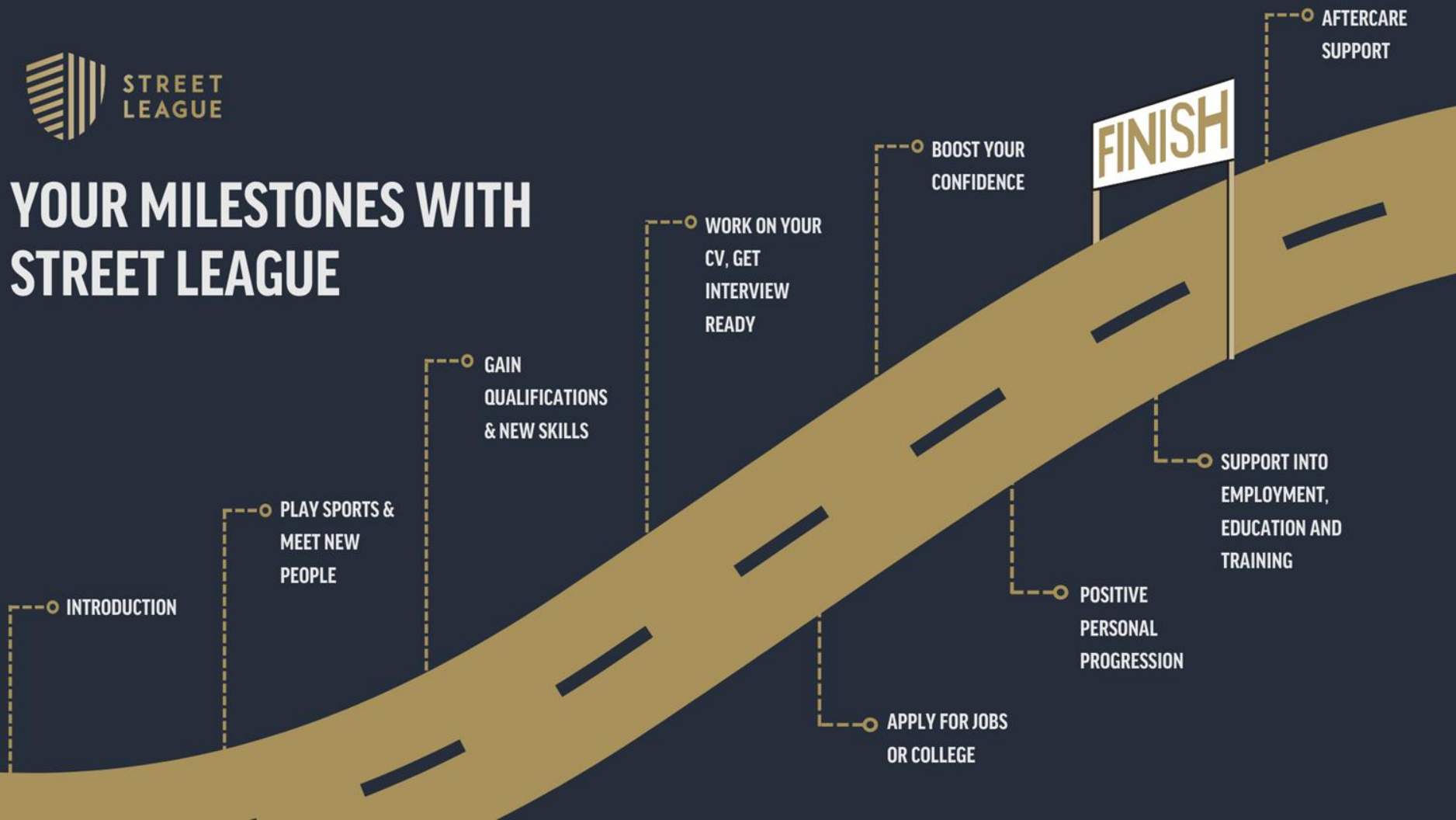

What do Street League Offer?



We offer a much more relaxed approach to education and look to support everyone in the way that best fits with their learning style. We also operate on a much smaller scales and only have a maximum of 12 people per venue with a minimum of 2 staff on at all times.

Although we offer free sport to everyone, nobody is forced to play as this is only an added incentive. The main reason for our support is to progress someone through our Employability Academy and onto their next step, whether that be employment, education or training. We have two venues and offer a range of qualification such as;

Qualifications (Ages 16-18 only)

- Functional Skills Level 1&2 Maths (City & Guilds).
- Functional Skills Level 1&2 English (City & Guilds).

- Level 1&2 Employability.
- Level 1 Professions in Sport.

- Chance to complete work experience.



What do Street League Offer?



We run Monday – Thursday 09:30 – 16:30 from our two sites over a 15 weeks block.

Monday = Maths & Sports Qual

Tuesday = English & Sports Qual

Wednesday = Employability & Sports Qual

Thursday = Employability & Sports Qual

After the 15 weeks we hope to have progressed them onto another course, or found them employment. If not, we do continue to work with them until they do find their next steps.

- Bursary available. This covers travel and lunch on a daily basis.



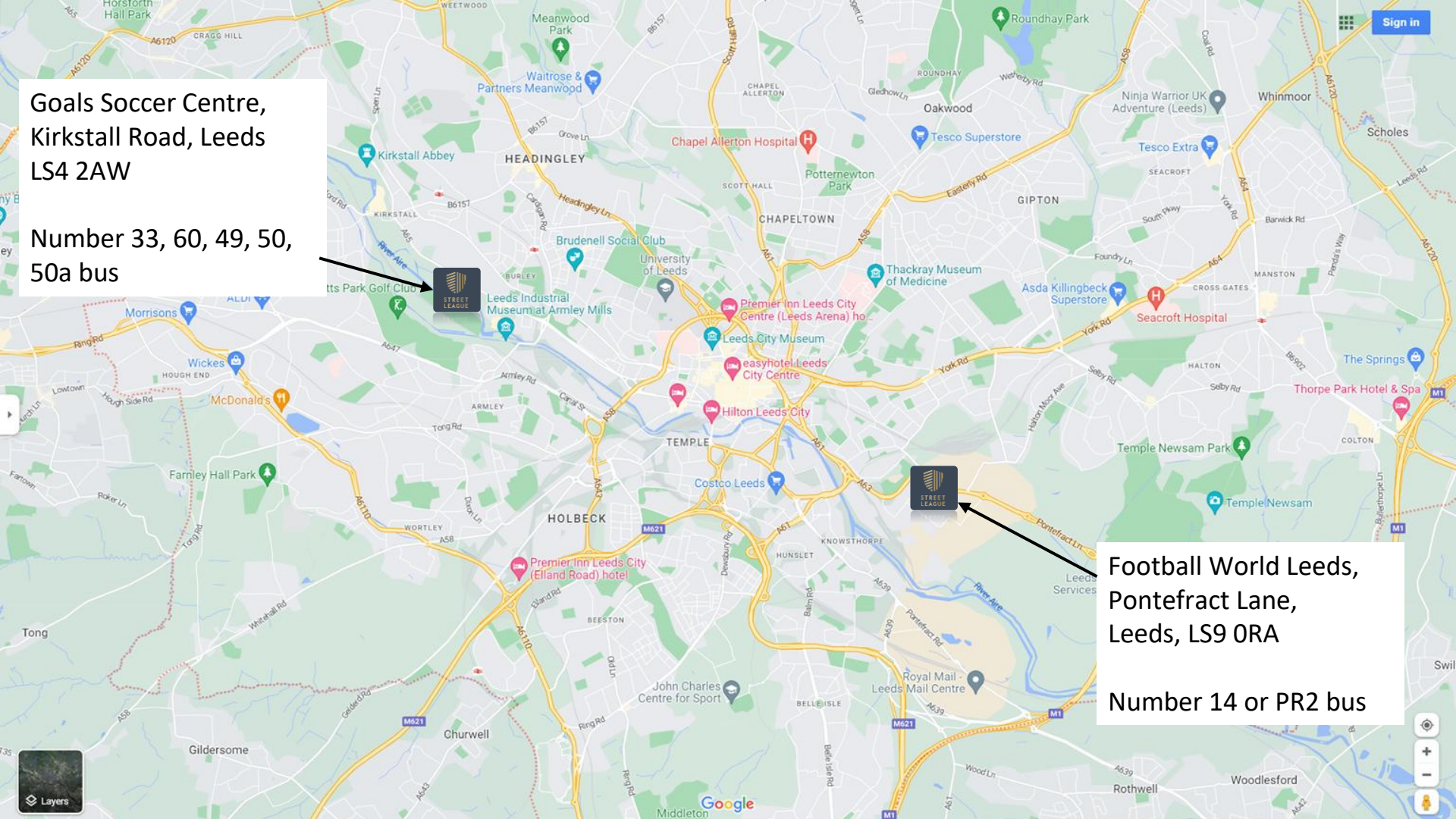

PARTICIPANT SUCCESS STORY: LEEDS



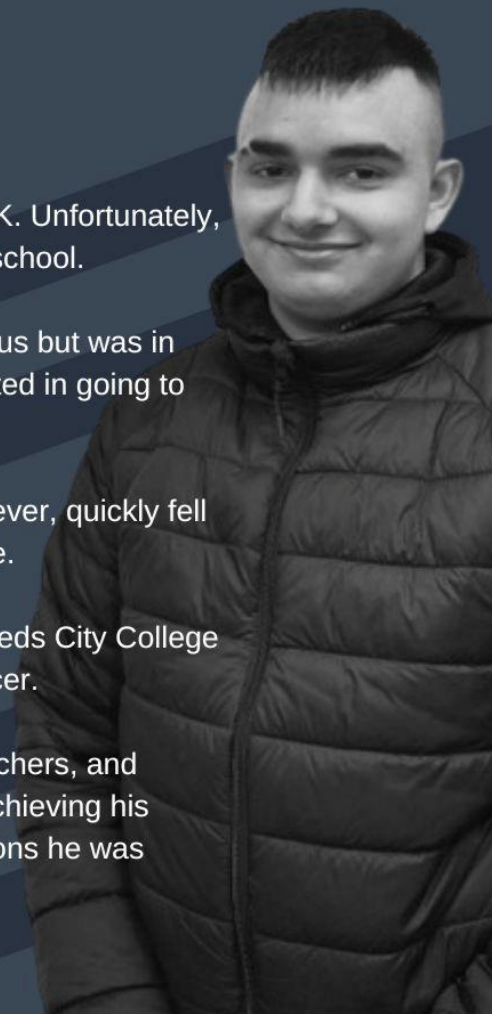
3 years ago, Patrik moved from Slovakia to England to begin life in the UK. Unfortunately, he was unable to achieve any qualifications in Maths or English while at school.

When Patrik first attended our programme, he was understandably nervous but was in good spirits, making him a great participant. Patrik was extremely interested in going to the gym and lifting weights.

Before Street League Patrik was not very interested in team sports. However, quickly fell in love with football, leading him to making new friends on the programme.

During Patrik's time at Street League, he decided he wanted to attend Leeds City College to study Public Services with his overall dream of becoming a Police Officer.

After visiting several open days, having discussions with all his future teachers, and submitting his application, he was invited to an interview. As a result of achieving his Maths and English Functional Skills, Employability, and Sports qualifications he was offered a place on the course which is due to start in September.

What Is Leeds Pathways Support Team

- * Careers information, advice and guidance (IAG).
- Post 16 applications (College, Sixth Forms, Training Providers, Apprenticeships).
- One to one tailored support (signposting to services to address barriers to progression).
- Support with creating a CV.
- The Pathways team support NEET young people in years 12 and 13 and those in year 11 who are at risk of NEET. Referrals for year 11 students will be considered for young people where attempts by school to contact and engage young people on their post 16 options have been exhausted.

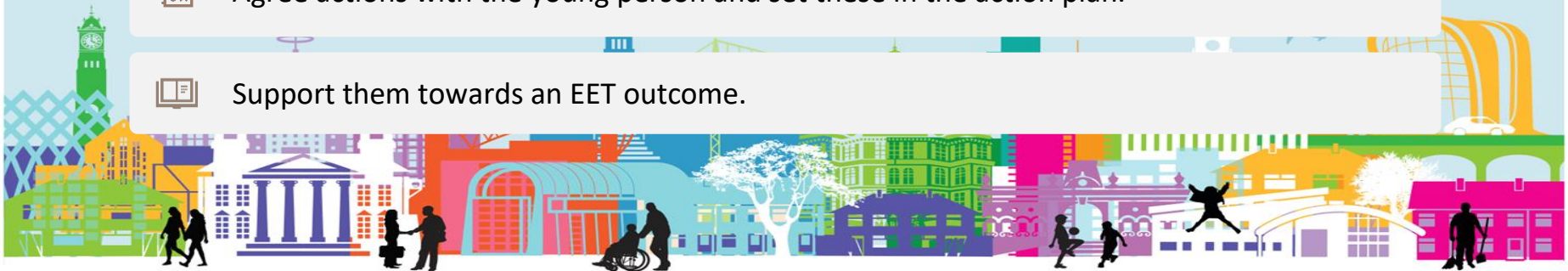
