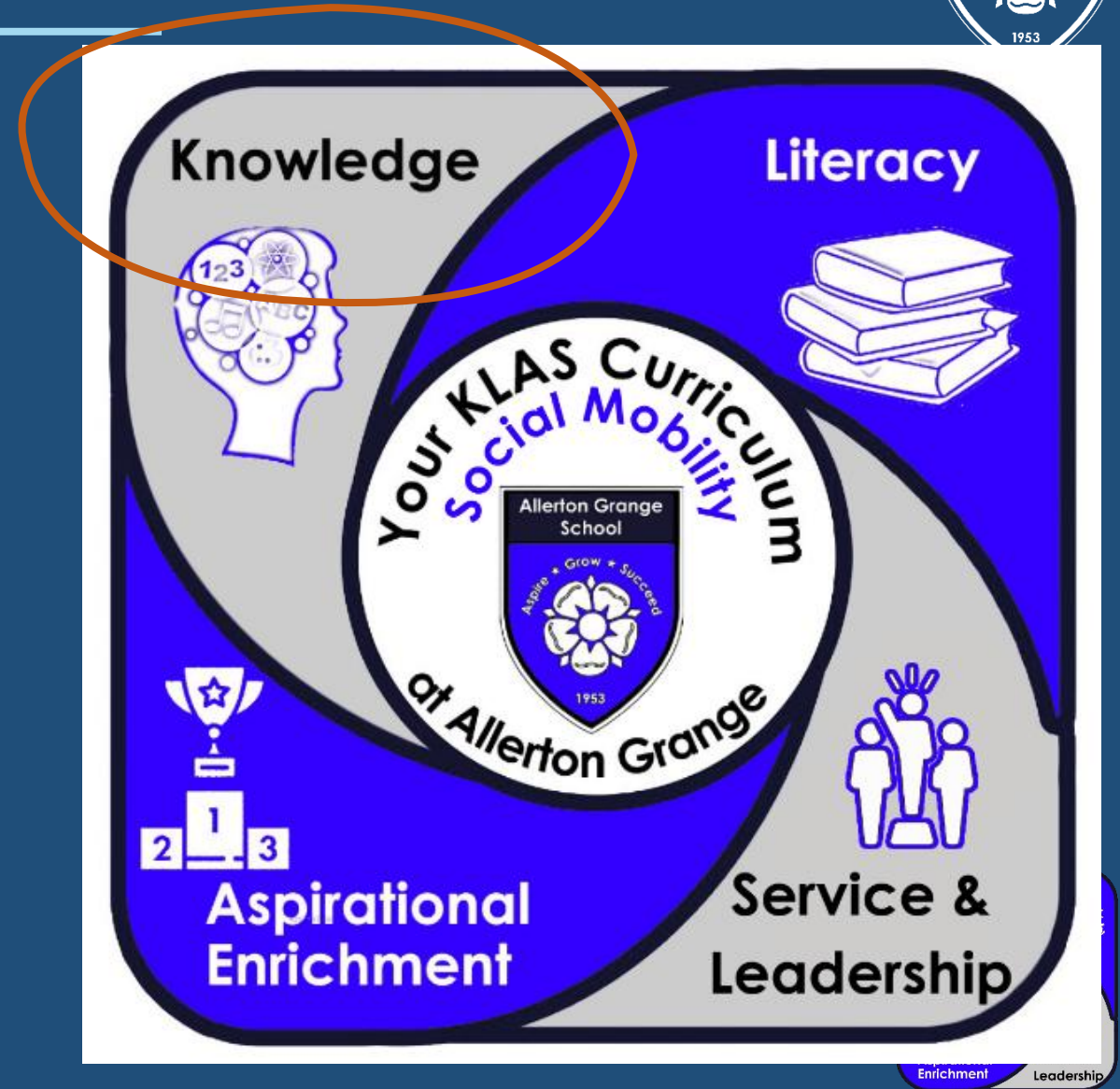
Delayed Gratification

Exam timetables

Queue up in silence
