




Guidance and Support: Choosing GCSE options 2026-2028

Compulsory Subjects at GCSE

Allerton Grange School

Maths

This is tiered entry, with final decision being made by the Maths team in Year 10. Top attaining students have the option to take Additional Maths GCSE (after school as enrichment).

English Language and English Literature

Students will be taught and sit two GCSEs.

Science

Combined or Triple Science options. The decision on whether your child will be entered for Combined or Triple is made by the science department, after several assessments.

Religious Studies

This is a short course GCSE (equivalent to half a GCSE) with option to take the full GCSE as an enrichment after school.

Humanities

History **or** Geography



Changes for this cohort



We are looking at making **Modern Foreign Languages optional**, giving students more freedom in their GCSE subject choices.

Increased Flexibility

The change allows tailoring education to personal interests and future goals beyond a fixed curriculum.

Student autonomy

Optional languages support personalised learning and encourage engagement with subjects that students are passionate about.



Understanding the English Baccalaureate



EBacc Subject Requirements

The EBacc includes English, Maths, Science, History or Geography, and a Modern Foreign Language plus one other option, forming a rigorous academic foundation.

Benefits of EBacc (Department for Education)

EBacc subjects are essential for many university degrees and are said to open up numerous academic and career opportunities.

Concerns and Limitations (Department for Education)

Recent reviews highlight concerns that EBacc may limit access to options subjects such as Computing, and the Arts, restricting subject choice.

Balanced Curriculum Approach - Allerton Grange

The school aims to provide a balanced curriculum including **both** EBacc and non-EBacc subjects to support diverse student interests.



Valuing Different Pathways



Balanced Curriculum Approach

The school values both traditional academic subjects and creative disciplines for a well-rounded education.

Personalised Subject Choices

Students choose subjects aligned with their university or career goals, supporting individual aspirations.

Arts and Creativity

Non-EBacc subjects like Drama, Music, and 3D Design are integrated and highly valued in the curriculum.

Student-Centered Approach

Encouraging exploration of passions and strengths fosters academic success and personal growth.



What can students choose?



Wide Subject Variety

Students can choose from a broad range of subjects including languages, arts, and physical education.

Academic and Creative Fields

Subjects cater to both academic interests like Classics or Computer Science, and creative talents like Drama and Music.

Practical and Physical Skills

Courses like Food Technology and Physical Education promote practical skills as well as theory.



What might inform a student's decision?



Students will have:

- Assemblies from all options subjects;
- A detailed options booklet sent electronically;
- · Discussions with teachers.



Why Study a Language at GCSE?



Business leaders estimate they are losing £300,000 pa due to language barriers.

87% of UK workers said language differences caused external challenges for their company

Over half of UK professionals said they feel 'embarrassed' that international colleagues are expected to switch to English.

To be updated with scientific-technical advances, any researcher or professional needs to know other languages.

Languages and Business

Language skills reduce communication challenges and financial losses in global business environments.

Advantage in STEM

Multilingualism enables essential international collaboration and progress in science, technology, engineering, and maths fields.

Human Connection vs Translation Tools

Learning languages fosters genuine human interaction beyond what AI translation tools can provide.

Skills and Intellectual Values

Language learning enhances critical thinking, creative problem solving, cultural and emotional intelligence oracy, precision and tolerance of ambiguity.

What changes have we made to the process?



Earlier Submission Timeline

The school has moved the GCSE options submission deadline to **28**th **November** as this new process will require additional planning

Options Letter Distribution

Parents and students receive an options letter before the half-term break outlining subjects and selection process. This includes a comprehensive options booklet.

Curriculum Planning

Earlier preference submission allows the school to analyse interests and design an appropriate curriculum model.

Parent-Student Engagement

Parents are encouraged to discuss subject choices with children and contact staff with questions.



What changes have we made to the process?



- Students are asked to list up to 4 preferences.
- The reason we are asking for this is to ensure that if a subject is oversubscribed, we have a range of options.
- We will use a fair selection process, which *may* be informed by student's academic profile in a particular subject, and that aligns with other choices.
- As a school, we will be required to make final decisions on options to ensure that class sizes are appropriate and that we are fully staffed in each subject.




