Dropping off and collecting students at the end of the day

We are still concerned that there will be a serious accident, due to dangerous driving and parking, and ask parents and carers to be more careful.

If you are dropping off or collecting children by car at the beginning and end of the day, please be considerate to pedestrians and other road users.

The Talbot Avenue entrance is a pedestrian entrance for students and is very busy before and after school.

Please do not stop outside school on Talbot Avenue to drop off or pick up children. This poses a risk to both drivers and pedestrians.

The Turning Circle, accessible from Lidgett Lane, is there for parents and carers to drop off and pick up children.

Alternatively, you can arrange to collect children from nearby streets.

Students will be reminded in school about road safety, and the importance of checking for traffic before crossing a road. Please talk to your children about road safety, particularly if they are walking to school by themselves for the first time.

The safety of our students is our priority, and we must ensure they center and exit the school site safely.

Access to the School Site

Morning:

Talbot Avenue - **The gates open at 8.10 am and close at 8.40 am.** Students arriving late will need to press the Student button at the gate to be let through to the Student Entrance/ Attendance Office.

Lidgett Lane - The gates will open at 8.15 am and close at 8.25 am. Students arriving late will need to enter school via Talbot Avenue. All cars must leave the Turning Circle area by 8.25 am.

Afternoon:

Talbot Avenue - The gates open at 3.00 pm and close at 3.30 pm.

Lidgett Lane - The gates to the Turning Circle open at 2.40 pm and will be locked at 3.30 pm. All cars must leave this area by 3.30 pm, when the gates will be locked.

Students staying in school for after school activities will be supervised by staff and taken to the gate to leave safely via Talbot Avenue.

<u>Aurism Arena</u> is a new locally based non-profit community interest company that aims to help parents and carers understand autism and neurodiversity better, empower them to be more confident advocates for their child and have a positive impact on family time and family support.

Autism Arena are a team consisting of a GP, children's social worker and a teacher (SENCo) who all have lived experience as parents/carers of autistic and neurodivergent children. They understand the challenges that families face and want to share their skills to help make other families' journeys easier.

They have funding from the National Lottery Community Fund to deliver webinars and peer support sessions online in the 2024-25 school year. They are also offering free in-person SEND events/coffee mornings in settings. Find out more.

Reading Cloud

Reading Cloud is the school's library management software.



The Reading Cloud student portal is now available for Allerton Grange Students to explore. It can be accessed via: www.readingcloud.net.

From here, type or select Allerton Grange School in the site field then select log in through Microsoft. This will sign in students automatically if they are accessing from a school computer; if accessing from home they just need to use their Allerton Grange username and password.

Once logged in there is lots to discover. Students can browse the library catalogue online, renew books remotely, read and write student book reviews, and explore some of the curated reading lists we have developed, as well as creating their own.

Mr Ellis, School Librarian said:

Tickets would make a great Christmas present!




Flu Vaccinations

- If you are booking a community clinic appointment for 3 or more children, please contact us on 0113 8433101 and they will assist you.
