Emily in Year 10 said "it was an amazing experience that taught her so much about devising theatre and has helped her think about her career in the future."








Art & Design Exhibition

RSC Analyst Competition by Ms Staley - Teacher of Chemistry and Physics

On Wednesday 4 June, Year 12 students competed in the School's Analyst Competition run by the Royal Society of Chemistry; a practical based challenge.

Although students were competing in groups with each other, this is a national competition and therefore they were also in competition with schools across the country.

This year's challenge was to analyse soil samples to determine if the area they came from was suitable for building.

Students completed 3 separate practical challenges, some of which they had not had any experience of, as they were using techniques that they will be using at university.

This drew on their planning, collaboration and communication skills to ensure they completed the tasks without help.

All students were exemplary at showing the AGS values, particularly being curious and courageous, as well as ambitious with the self-belief that they were more than capable of completing the tasks.


