Allerton Grange is ready to go for September:

I am delighted to be able to share with you that despite a national teacher recruitment crisis, particularly in the secondary sector, Allerton Grange is fully staffed with specialist qualified teachers to deliver our curriculum in September. There are currently 70 secondary teacher vacancies in Leeds schools alone. So, it is reassuring to know that at this point of the year we have already recruited all the teachers we require to run our curriculum next year.

Allerton Grange invests in Teaching and Learning:

This week, we have started a major investment project into IT developments at Allerton Grange. Over the summer, we will be investing £600,000, installing state-of-the-art digital screens in all our classrooms and office spaces (replacing projectors and whiteboards), and updating all staff and student laptops to support the roll out of Windows 11. These developments will mean that Allerton Grange students are not only taught by qualified specialist teachers but they are learning in a state-of-the-art environment.






Book your place at
