Exam etiquette

- make alternative arrangements for after school activities

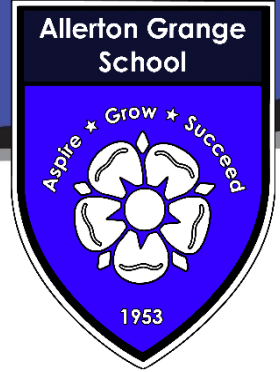


Rooms
