NEU STRIKE ACTION DAYS 3 & 4 – WEDNESDAY 15 AND THURSDAY 16 MARCH

In January, the National Education Union announced national and regional action in England. This action is targeted directly at the government who has failed to provide a fully funded, above-inflation pay rise for all teachers.

Four strike days have been announced: 1 and 28 February; and 15 and 16 March.

We know that we currently have 53 teaching members of the NEU at Allerton Grange (50% of our teaching staff), and it is our assumption that each member is likely to strike. In addition, we predict some staff will have to juggle childcare difficulties with primary schools closing. We have completed a risk assessment which recognises safeguarding risks as high, as a result we are unable to operate as normal. Therefore, we are making the following contingency plans for days three and four (15 & 16 March).

- School will be closed for students in **Years 7, 8, 9 and 10**. These students will be expected to engage in independent remote learning, available on the website, along with Class Charts. A text message will be sent to parents with a link to the remote learning.
- Pastoral and SEND teams have identified up to 50 vulnerable students who will be invited into school to work online throughout the day. These students will be supervised by pastoral teams.
- The plans for Years 11, 12 and 13 are as follows:
 - **Years 12 and 13** students will be expected to attend school from 09:35 and follow their usual timetable. If any of their lessons are cancelled on the day we expect students to study independently in the sixth form centre. They will finish school at their usual time.
 - **Year 11** students will be expected to attend school from 08:45 and will take part in a number of revision sessions throughout the day. These sessions will take the form of guided exam papers in Maths, English History, Geography and RS. Students will finish school at 12:30. Y11 GCSE students in Art, Music, German, Photography and Product Design/Textiles are expected to remain in school, for additional revision classes, until 3.00 pm.

All students in Years 11, 12 and 13, and invited vulnerable students, are expected to be in school on both days. Any non-attendance will be recorded as unauthorised.
