Report Data - What next?

If your predicted grades are in line with your college/6th form offers

- ACTION** 
- ✔ You should ensure that you keep up to date with all class work and homework.
 - ✔ Your revision techniques would appear to be successful, but please make sure you seek help if you could use some advice with revision techniques.
 - ✔ You should now be starting your revision for your GCSE exams. If you haven't done so already, make a revision timetable (it helps to add other commitments to a revision timetable, to ensure it's realistic for you to stick to).
 - ✔ Don't take your foot off the pedal! You don't have to keep up the intensity of work for much longer, but you do have to keep it up until your exams are over!
 - ✔ Check-in with your teachers regularly and let them know if you'd like any additional revision materials or extra help with specific topics.
 - ✔ Use the Exams & Revision section of the school website for subject specific revision materials.

Report Data - What next?

If your predicted grades are **NOT** in line with what you need for college/6th form...



- ✔ Face up to your current situation. Hiding from it or ignoring it will NOT help. You have a huge team of staff here to support you, please talk to them and ask for/accept help. It's our job to help you and we will ALWAYS do whatever we can to help you, both academically and pastorally.
- ✔ Arrange a meeting with your subject teacher/s to go through exactly what you can do in the next 3 months to boost your grade.
- ✔ Arrange a meeting with Mrs Mills, to discuss back-up options, in case you don't get the grades you need for the course/college you want.
- ✔ Think carefully about other commitments and what you are spending your time doing. You only have 3-4 months of hard work to go and that's it for GCSEs - FOR THE REST OF YOUR LIFE! If you have to make some sacrifices in your social and extra-curricular life, I'd suggest now would be the time to do it. In a few months time, you will have more than enough time to pursue your hobbies and social life.
- ✔ Use the Exams & Revision section of the school website for subject specific revision materials.

Colleges (including Allerton Grange 6th Form), are strict with their entry criteria and you have to be realistic about your grades. Make sure you have a sensible back-up plan in place, to avoid unnecessary stress and worry on results day. Please speak to Mrs Mills if you have not got a back-up plan and applications in place.

Do what's right and what will give you the best chance of success, NOT what others are doing or what is the most convenient.

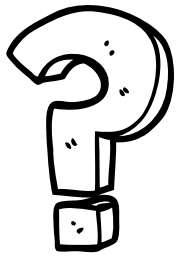
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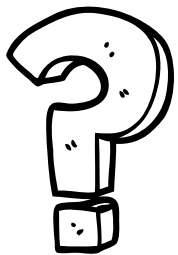

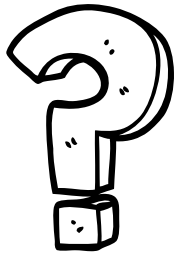
Other questions to ask yourself...



Are you regularly checking emails for contact from college? They may be asking you to attend a welcome day or go to an interview. You **MUST** respond to these, otherwise they will assume you don't want the place and delete your application



Have you accepted college offers? You can accept more than one college offer, to give yourself some choice/flexibility in the summer. *Roundhay 6th form will ask you to commit to enrolling and completing work for each A Level subject over the summer. They want to know if you're serious about going there. If you do not want a place at Roundhay 6th Form, let them know.



Have you created a CV? Use your Unifrog account to do this and save it. You'll always need one, and it helps if you've got a template to work from. If you leave Allerton Grange after Year 11, your account will be deleted. Make use of it and the tools it offers while you have it.

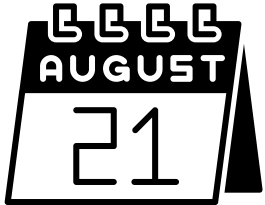

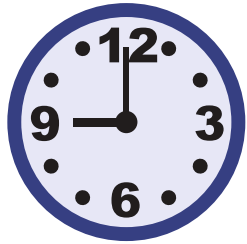
Results Day

Your GCSE results are available from 9am - 12pm on results day and college enrollment will happen either on this day or very shortly after. Make sure you are in the country and available to attend enrollment, or you risk not having a place at college for September.

Enrolling at college

A form of identification (e.g your passport, a bank card, your birth certificate etc.

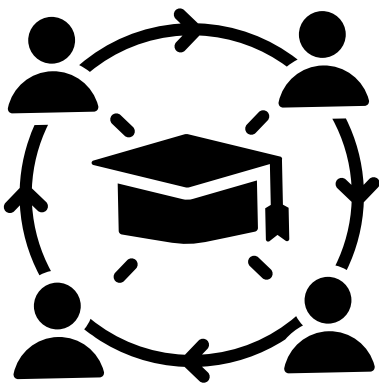
