Admissions Statement

Allerton Grange is an inclusive school. Applications to our sixth form are considered individually as part of our contextualised admissions process in order to encourage aspirational applications. Therefore, entry requirements may be adjusted in specific circumstances.

Where students do not meet the entry requirements to progress to Level 3 courses, or to enrol on specific subjects, a contextualised offer may be made. For example, we may make an offer where we will accept a grade 5 in English Literature in place of a grade 5 in English Language. Contextualised offers are made at the discretion of the Sixth Form team and are not guaranteed.

In line with UCAS, contextualised admissions are used at different stages of the application process, as part of a holistic assessment in order to:

- Inform a decision, including inviting them for advice and guidance meetings, contextual offers, and acknowledge 'near miss' applicants at enrolment.
- identify applicants who may need additional support.
- help assess applicants' eligibility for financial support.
