

Frequently Asked Questions: Facts and Figures

How many students do you have at Allerton Grange?

In Sixth Form we have 240 students across Year 12 and Year 13.

We have 1620 students at Allerton Grange from Year 7 to Year 13. In 2020, Year 7 increased to 300 students, with 10 forms of around 30 students. We have a waiting list in all year groups.

How big are your classes?

We are lucky to be able to offer smaller class sizes for Sixth Form students. Exact numbers vary year on year and by subject but the average would be around 12 students.

Do your students get good exam results?

We have seen four consecutive years of improved GCSE and A Level outcomes. Prior to COVID-19, in 2019 there was a 96% A level pass rate with students gaining top results including AAAA, AABA, AAA, AAB grades. 34% of students received offers from Russell Group Universities.

Where do students go next?

Last year 99% of students went on to their choice of university, apprenticeship or employment.

What are the key points of the last Ofsted report for Allerton Grange School?

The last Ofsted inspection was in February 2019. Allerton Grange was considered to be Good in all areas.

The highlights noted were the family atmosphere within school; pupils enjoying the diversity of being at a multicultural school; that leaders want every pupil to aim high and fulfil their potential; that the curriculum is challenging, but there is support in place to make sure that all pupils can access the work and make progress; pupils are happy and feel safe. They value the support they receive from their teachers and pastoral support staff.

The areas highlighted for further improvement were:

- 1. KLAS Curriculum embed across all years and all subjects
- 2. Make sure aspirational enrichment is fairly accessed by all students from all backgrounds
- 3. Too many students regular attenders of isolation. Need to make sure there are fewer of them.

All of these areas are currently being actively worked on within school.
